

If we lived each day aware of our connection with God what would our lives include? How might three actions of seeking, loving and walking keep us close God? How might the world be a different place if we did?

The logo is made up of three spiraling brush strokes coming together at the centre. Energy and transition are conveyed as the shapes rotate both outward and inward toward the centre, where they overlap and blend.

The colours reflect the sacred colours and directions of Aboriginal tradition: red the South, yellow the East, black the West, and white the North.

The three brush strokes also represent the Trinity, with the centre forming the shape of the fish, the symbol for Jesus Christ and the shape of our United Church crest.
